### Botanical Name

*Buxus 'Glencoe'*

### Family

Buxaceae

### Common Name

Chicagoland Green® Boxwood

### Origin

A selected hybrid from the research collections of the Chicago Botanic Garden, Glencoe, Illinois.

### Hardiness

U.S.D.A. Zone 4 (possibly better). Plants under evaluation withstood record low temperatures (-22°F to -37°F) with no dieback in the winter of 1993-94.

### General Description and Habit

A broadleaf evergreen shrub with a dense, broad-oval habit.

### Size

Grows 3' to 4' in height with a 5' spread in 15 years.

### Growth Rate

Slow to medium; typically less than 6" annually.

### Ornamental Characteristics

#### *Foliage*

Attractive medium-green in summer, developing a slight bronze tint in winter.

### Culture

Easily transplanted B & B or from containers. Best sited in filtered sun, although performance of evaluation plants in full sun, as well as shaded locations, has been good. Extremely wet sites should be avoided.

### Pest and Disease Resistance

Excellent. Boxwood psyllid has been observed periodically but has not significantly affected ornamental qualities.

### Landscape Value

Excellent for hedges, borders, accents, groupings, foundation plantings and formal gardens.

### Propagation

Hardwood or softwood cuttings.
